Companion on the Journey

At a recent Confirmation retreat for students and sponsors, I couldn't find one of my helpers, a lady named Peggy. So, I took the microphone and, using my best Kermit the Frog voice, I called out “Uh, Miss Peggy?”

Now, I don't think that my impression of Kermit is that good, but everyone, young and old alike, recognized his voice. Many people laughed and yelled out “Kermit!”

Kermit's voice is distinct. So is Jesus' voice, but does his voice get our attention?

Jesus says, “He who enters through the gate is the shepherd; ... the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out ... and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They will never follow a stranger, but run away because they do not recognize the voice of strangers.” (John 10:1-5)

Ask yourself this question: What does that scripture really mean to me? When was the last time you heard Jesus' voice? Did you recognize his voice when you heard it?

The Holy Spirit is the voice of Jesus. How do you hear him? Through Scripture, Liturgy, and the Church? How else do you hear him? Does he ever speak directly to you?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches about the regular “promptings,” “interventions” and “inspirations” of the Holy Spirit in all of our lives. (CCC 1830-1831, 1966, 2000) Do you experience those things? How do you recognize the Spirit's voice, especially since it often sounds very much like your own voice? How do you discern his voice from convincing, but false, impersonations of him? Do you encourage others to listen for the Spirit's voice themselves?

These are not idle questions. Our Church teaches that the New Covenant is the gift of the Holy Spirit, and that the Spirit is always active in our lives - leading, guiding, prompting, teaching. Are you living in the New Covenant? How is your life different as a result? Will you tell others, helping them into a New Covenant life too? If not you, then who?

Getting to Know Our Charismatic Priests: Father Fidelis Igwenwanne

Rev. Fidelis Igwenwanne, PHD, BCC, serves as the Catholic Chaplain at Mercy Gilbert Medical Center, Gilbert and Chandler Regional Medical Center, Chandler (Arizona). He is a member of the National Association of Catholic Chaplains (NACC) and a board certified Chaplain after successfully completing four Units of Clinical Pastoral Education at Banner health CPE program in Phoenix. Fr. Fidelis holds Bachelors and Masters degrees in Theology (Missiology) from Pontifical Urbana University, Rome, Italy and a Doctorate Degree in Philosophy from that same University, excelling with "Magna Cum Laude" honors. Fr. Fidelis is originally from Nigeria. He has naturalized in the United States of America as a Citizen. He belongs to Issele-Uku diocese in Nigeria. Before Fr. Igwenwanne went to Rome for further studies, he held many posts of responsibilities in Nigeria. One of them was the director of Emmaus International School of Evangelization, which inspired him to become more actively involved in the work of the New Evangelization, the Clarion call of our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II. In this capacity he traveled to many different parts of Africa in order to coordinate schools. Fr. Fidelis is a proud member of the Knights of Columbus. He enjoys being called, brother priest and brother Knight. He recently joined the Knights of Columbus Council, #10832 called: Journey of faith Council of St Luke Catholic Church, Phoenix. He is a 4th degree Knight and also a friar of Bishop Gomez Assembly, #1805 Phoenix, AZ. Fr. Fidelis has authored five books: "Come Holy Spirit," "God the Father of Love," "A Priest: Who Is He Amongst You," "The Concept of God in Igbo Traditional Religion," and his latest work, "A Man For God and For Others: A Personal Reflection on Catholic Priesthood" published in November 2012. Fr. Igwenwanne has won the admiration of many through his charming personality, scintillating and powerful homilies, his ardent pastoral zeal and exemplary priestly life.

The New Evangelization – Part 7

An acquaintance recently returned from the canonizations in Rome, and told of speaking with a Vatican guard: "Does the Pope really sneak out at night?" "Every night." "Does he really go to be with the poor?" "Every night."

In his Apostolic Exhortation, "Evangelii Gaudium" (EG), Pope Francis tells us, "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries,' but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples.'" (EG 120)

The Pope leads by example via his nightly escapades with the poor, saying "there is a kind of preaching which falls to each of us as a daily responsibility... Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others, and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place: on the street, in a city square, during work, on a journey." (EG127)

The Pope simply evangelizes, while we ourselves often tend to institutionalize evangelization. We invent programs and training for door-to-door evangelization, or feeding the poor, or ...? You name it.

My family moved around a lot when I was growing up. It was tough to always be starting over in new places. But, I remember a couple of places where the neighbors came over with food, flowers and gifts to welcome us to the neighborhood. I remember a neighbor who would periodically, and unexpectedly, show up at our door with a pie that she had baked.

We can do those types of things without a formal program, and it is real evangelization: "to bring the love of Jesus to others." (EG 127)

Evangelizing is not just bringing food to the poor or to your neighbor, or preaching to them; it is eating with them, befriending them, loving them, and sharing with them the love you've experienced from God, through Christ Jesus. That's how Pope Francis spends his nights.

In the New Evangelization, "the first step is personal dialog, when the other person shares his or her joys, hopes and concerns for loved ones... Only afterward is it possible to bring up God's word." (EG 128)

Al Amador Spoke at the Men's Ministry Meeting April 26



The Queen of Peace Men's Ministry Group had it's monthly Saturday morning meeting on April 26. Guest speaker, Al Amador, presented an encouraging witness to the group on the power of prayer in his life and how and why he is now absolutely convinced that prayer does work in all circumstances. After he spoke, he prayed with the men who were there.

Al and his wife, Merce, currently serve the Phoenix Catholic Renewal in intercession and prayer ministry.

Al has been in the Renewal 20 years. While living in Los Angeles he formed a non-profit organization called Luz De Cristo. They put on big events with famous Priests from Latin America. These events were filmed and made into 55 one hour Spanish programs which were then transmitted by Spanish EWTN TV throughout Latin America and the United States.
